
It is certified that:-

- (a) The applicant owns & manages 100 Bedded Hospital which was established in 2010.
- (b) It is desirable to establish an Ayurved college in the public interest for starting BAMS course.
- (c) Establishment of Ayurved college with 100 (Hundred) admission capacity BAMS course at Baramati is feasible.

It is also certified that adequate clinical material as per norms of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine is available with the proposed Ayurved College. It is further certified that in case the Government of Maharashtra fails to create infrastructure for the Ayurved college as per National Commission for Indian System of Medicine norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the college with the permission of the Central Government.
